
GREETINGS FROM THE EAST...



The Temple in the Gospel of Luke

Lk 21:5-19 By: Rev. Msgr. Thomas D. Knopf-Bigelow, LOH

On 14 November I had the opportunity to preach and celebrate Mass, that being the 33rd Sunday in the Church's calendar. It was also the first time that I had the opportunity to pull from Luke the building of the Temple and its significance for us person-



ally. I wanted to share this with you.

There were people looking at the Temple, marveling - "...how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, He said 'all these things you are staring at now - the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another; everything will be destroyed.' (vs. 5-6) I went through two other readings for that morning, but here I want to focus on the Temple. Jesus spoke of the destruction of the Temple. He was referring to Himself.

In God's eye, we were created by Him as Temples for His Holy Spirit. I, though, (patting my stomach) have been working on creating a Cathedral! And – even our Temples of physical form will, also, be destroyed.

Solomon's Temple was a marvel. Each stone was cut precisely to fit into its designated space. Each stone was made smooth with the simplest of instruments. Each massive stone was transported individually from quarry to the

Temple site for placement. This placement fit so perfectly there was no need for any other tool of workmanship to correct any errors. Each stone slipped into place perfectly. Stones weighing tons!

In God's creation of each one of us, he has done the work perfectly. He has blessed us, in the Christian tradition, with the Holy Spirit at baptism, such that His creation is at perfection. In our earthly temple, God provides for each of us that communion which fills the spaces within our heart and soul needing Him the most.

What we see from our mind's eye is what the world calls imperfection: ravages of disease, birth defects, rough living, mental illness, poverty, addictions, etc. We fail to look at God's creation in us as a whole, 'remarking how it is adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings.' Are you seeing in other people that they are temples of God's creation? Yes, they may be a bit weather worn, tending to lean one way or the other, creak and grown, missing a step or two. But – with all our outward appearances, God asks us to see Him in the building our earthly temples, to recognize that it is He who validates life in others, thus demanding that we receive others and self, with thanksgiv-

ing, respect, tolerance, and love. His tools are your hands welcoming Him in others. Your feet are His feet walking alongside a brother or sister needing support. Your voice is His voice reassuring, comforting, lifting, and giving witness to one another.

When our individual earthly temples are destroyed, only then will we truly understand that the Heavenly Architect has led us from the blue print to the reality of His continuous love. Make witness to that in everything you do (vs. 13-15).
