

This last Wednesday, I had an opportunity to lengthen mine. I have done ritual in the other chairs, but nothing does compare to sitting in the Oriental Chair. I practiced like no other time in my Masonic career and was very nervous. When it was all over, the sense of accomplishment was awesome, and I know that it is something that I can do again. As the new sheriff in town he will be telling us about how his department will be operated under him and what he sees as areas in the county that need his attention. As we have often heard that due to the great Anoka fire of Aug. 1884 our lodge meeting place and all its records and effects were lost. I have been spending a lot of time at the current office of the Anoka County Union going over the back issues that cover this period. I will not be at the March stated meeting but will instead be attending the 100th Anniversary celebration of the Triune Temple building in St. Paul. As you may know we will be doing the same thing in 2022. I thought it might be informative to see how they do this down in the big city! I do not believe that any other such celebrations are planned between now and 2022 so I thought here is our one and only chance to see what we might want to plan for.
