### GREETINGS FROM THE EAST!



On Aug 27, the adults have planned an all day mystery trip for the girls


Our next meeting is Aug. 29, and we are visiting the Robbinsdale DeMolay meeting on Sept 1 and making them Ice Cream Sundaes.




