The foundation of Freemasonry is, and must always be, Respect. All other moral and social virtues must be derived from this single point. We must Respect ourselves; we must Respect each other; and we must Respect those outside our Fraternity, even when they oppose us. Respect is similar, but critically different from Tolerance. Tolerance accepts that which is different than itself, but Respect embraces these differences, even when one disagrees with them. We must acknowledge the differences in opinion and belief that distinguish one man or Mason from another and embrace them as equally as valid as our own. These differences, when respected and embraced, can strengthen us as a society and are, I feel, an essential part of our humanity to one another. Ultimately, I have learned that to disrespect the views or opinions of others is un-Masonic, un-American, and inhumane.

There is a great deal of dirt-flinging and name-calling in the media today, all originating from a variety of political and religious sources. All with their own agendas and all with the intent on swaying us to their platforms by means of fear, uncertainty and doubt. All with a complete lack of Respect. There are many Brothers who hold religion, social, or political positions I absolutely disagree with. But, as a Mason and as an American, I would never disrespect them or their opinions. I will love and support them as best I feel comfortable with. As Masons, we must not measure a Brother, or anyone, by the organizations they associate with or the beliefs they hold. We do not care what political views they hold; we care only that they are loyal citizens of our Nation. We do not care what religion they follow; we only care that they have a profound belief in something greater and above themselves. We do not care what social ideal they embrace; we just care that they are involved and invested in their community. Respect is the foundation of our Fraternity. It is the greatest lesson

Freemasonry can inculcate in our daily lives.

One avenue of mutual Respect is why a Brother joins the Lodge. Freemasonry is different things to different people. Each Brother became a Mason for their own personal reasons and many have found new reasons for membership since they joined. We join for Family; to maintain a personal family historical connection to the Craft. We join for the Fellowship; to have friends and events and other social elements. Some join to study the internal transformation our symbols and allegorical lessons can guide us through. Others petition membership because they feel Masonry will bring them closer to their Deity. And some are drawn to the ties of the ancient past our history brings. Many will join for any combination of the above or for some personal reason all their own. In the end, each Brother knocked on that door for personal reasons. Reasons we should all respect and support as we would have our reasons respected and supported.

Finally: We officers have decided to begin holding regular, if not annual, Lodges of Instruction: The Dusty Square and Compass. These events will be held at the Lodge and are designed to aid Brothers who feel they have forgotten the various Words and Passes and therefore are uncomfortable in coming to Lodge meetings. As we are still working out the details, final information on dates and times will be sent out on a later date. If you are interested, or know someone who might be, please contact the Lodge.

FROM THE WEST

The Masonic Fraternity is known for many things. Our detractors focus on the Morgan Affair. They focus on our secrecy. They point to our symbols and twist and turn

them for their own purpose, not what we intend them to be for our own use.

We focus on Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. Contributing to the relief of poor, distressed Master Masons, their widows and orphans. Passing the hat.

We focus on making men better. Helping out our community and each other. We may not be known for everything that we do philanthropically, because we do not toot our horn. But here are some things that we should be tooting about:

-Minnesota Masons raised \$265,000 that was matched two for one by Masonic Charities (that is \$800,000) for food shelves around the state.

-We fund and support two incredible homes for elderly patients.

-Half a million dollars has been raised in scholarships by Masonic Lodges, Star Chapters and other Masonic Organizations (this also was matched).

-Our \$65 million dollar pledge to the U of M for the Masonic Cancer Center helps fund treatments and research to cure cancer. That is the goal: To cure cancer.

-Minnesota Masons raised over \$40,000 for Special Olympics Minnesota by participating in the Polar Plunge.

Locally, Anoka Lodge raises money for the ACBC Food Shelf, We Can Ride, and Stable Pathways. We support our Jobies going to camp, Grand Bethel, or anytime they need help. One of our Boy Scouts is going to the National Order of the Arrow Conference thanks to us. We give a couple of college scholarships away every year. I know that I am missing many items, and the OES does huge amounts of fundraising and practical charity each year. We have many things to be proud of.

We can do more.

I am not asking you to open your wallet. MN Masonic Charities will gladly take your donation, as last month's speaker talked about. Any of our organizations will also take a check. I am talking about the one-on-one assistance. Getting a widow's house ready for spring. Serving meals at a local

soup kitchen. Painting the halls of the Lodge or anything else that the House Committee may need. Helping the Boy Scouts by signing up to be a Merit Badge Councilor (you do

not have to be a registered Scouter). Volunteering at your church or a school.

With that being said, if you need assistance, do not hesitate to ask. We sometimes cannot help because we do not know a need exists. Whether it is chores around the house or help with dues because of a loss of job or cutback of hours, know that your Lodge is here to assist you, just as you have assisted others in the past. It is your turn to know that Brotherly Love and Relief if about.

We are men who have a strong belief that we should give back. Let us get in the quarries, roll up our sleeves and get to work.




