There is much information and instruction to be gained from the ritual of the degree and the obligations we take as Entered Apprentices. Another source of information that sometimes does not seem as prominent is the Charge read at the end of the ritual portion of the degree.

The Charge is read after the ritual of the degree is finished and before the lecture is presented. The Charge at Initiation for our new Entered Apprentices, presents many instructions, duties, and advice on how to act as a just and upright Mason. It sometimes seems that this advice and these instructions get lost in all the information received by an Entered Apprentice on the day of the degree. After the degree, the new Brothers spend time learning their proficiency and learning more about the information presented in the lecture. In May, our new Brothers will become Fellowcrafts, and in June Master Masons, and they will hear the Charge for those degrees. How long has it been since you read the Charge for each degree? They are printed out in full toward the back of our code book. They can be read at any time, and contain advice on not only how to act toward our Brothers of the Fraternity, but also on how to act outside the confines of the Lodge. It is not always easy to follow the advice and instruction found in the Charges of each degree. And we may never fully be able to achieve the expectations found in the Charges. The journey toward Masonic Light is not an easy or straight path. There are many twists and turns and obstacles that we meet along the way. The Charges help us overcome these obstacles and to learn from our mistakes.

I urge each of you to read the Charges of each degree. Then try to apply them to yourself every day. If each of us can consistently strive to follow the instruction and advice of the Charges, we can present to the public a view of who we are as Masons, and what Masonry is as the oldest and greatest Fraternity in the world. If we follow the Charges, that public view should be a good one.

As you have heard me at Lodge, the spring One-Day to Scottish Rite Masonry is set to convene. The date is May 10th and runs all day. The question is, will you be part of it? The Scottish Rite, as you know, is the "Graduate School" for receiving "further light in Masonry." The Scottish Rite is a series of 29 degrees put on in full costume, lighting and education before and after at the Minneapolis Valley over 16 Thursday nights. I am understating the fact that they are impressive and moving.

The One Day will consist of the "terminal degrees", the 4th, 14th, 18th, 30th and 32nd. This will make you Master of the Royal Secret and a member of the Scottish Rite. The day is long, but for those who cannot attend every Thursday for the fall or spring, it is a good option. At this time, I would be remiss in not encouraging you if you take this opportunity, to make sure you go back when you can and see the Degrees that you have missed.

If you have contemplated joining, I would personally invite you to print off a petition and bring it to Lodge to have two Scottish Rite members endorse your petition. There are a bunch of us around, and we would love to sign it. The cost is \$125. This will include a copy of "Morals and Dogma", and a copy of "A Bridge to Light." This is a limited-time price, and it should be noted that it does not include a ring or the cap; those are left to your own choice. Very few valleys offer this to their members. As in the

Blue Lodge, petitions must be read and then voted on. That vote occurs the beginning of May.

If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact me. I hope you will consider the offer, and join the Scottish Rite.
