

For anybody who is interested (new Brothers or guys who did not get one the first time around), Anoka Lodge has their own ring. You may have seen them on some of the Brothers. If you are interested in purchasing one, you can deal directly with the ring maker. Then name of the Brother who makes them is Gordon Spurlock and his phone number is 912-265-9591. They are \$105 and made of stainless steel (see picture). You need to get your ring sized correctly before calling him. With the stainless steel, they are not adjustable after they are struck. We do have a ring sizer in the display case if you need to know what size you are.

The truth is that the purity of our Entered Apprentice apron is still with us all, insomuch as it represents a blank slate on which we will inscribe our own path through Masonry. Although we are admonished to keep our apron spotless as a symbol of our conduct and actions, I am willing to bet our operative brothers soiled theirs to black as they increased in knowledge and took on greater work responsibilities. In a like manner I hope that I wear my apron into rags, symbolically, as I write my story of knowledge (light) and work (brotherhood and charity).

I realize that I can only offer avenues for furthering your education, hopefully revealing "more light in Masonry" along the way. One of my favorite tenets in Masonry is "meeting on the level". No one of us holds the knowledge or authority to do the work by our lonesome, so I will likewise be seeking education from my fellow Masons as often as I am providing it. 


This past month we had the chance to visit Montgomery Lodge #258 for their Master Masons Degree, The Brothers did a great job!
