Greetings Brethren of Anoka Lodge #30,

Happy New Year! I hope you all had a great Holiday season. The Anoka Lodge Installation of Officers was held on December 7th, and I am looking forward to a wonderful year serving Anoka Lodge as Worshipful Master in 2015. Plans are starting up to try and get more Brothers involved in Lodge events, and to help improve communication between the Brethren. Stay tuned for more information.

The beginning of a new year always makes me think about new beginnings. The beginning of a New Year brings more light to the world as the days begin to get longer (at least in the Northern hemisphere). This concept of more light and new beginnings is found in many cultures and religions around the world. Celebrations are held during this time of year to commemorate the end of darkness and the beginning of more light. One of the days for celebration is on December 27th, St. John the Evangelist Day. St. John the Evangelist is one of the Patron Saints of Freemasonry. The other is St. John the Baptist. These Saints are represented as part of a symbol of Masonry with which we are all familiar. This symbol is the point within a circle, bordered by 2 parallel lines, with a book of Holy Law at the top.

A common interpretation of this symbol is that the point is a man, and the circle is the limit beyond which our passions and actions should never extend. The book of Holy Law is a guide of faith, and the 2 parallel lines represent St. John the Evangelist and St. John the Baptist. As we travel around the circle we touch the book of

Holy Law and the teachings of both Saints. This symbol also has other interpretations, and I recommend beginning an investigation into the symbol to learn about these other interpretations. These teachings and interpretations can bring us to more Masonic light, just as the New Year brings more light to the world.

In January, we also begin a new cycle of degrees for our new group of candidates. I encourage all of you to attend the Entered Apprentice School of Instruction on Saturday, January 10th at 9:00 am at Anoka Lodge. Come and learn about the degree and why things are done in the degree in a certain way. This will not only help us in our Masonic journey to learn about our ritual, it will also help us learn how to bring more light to our new candidates as they begin their Masonic journey in the New Year.


I do have a couple of requests:
