

# Our First "First Day Cover"

As some of you may know there has been an effort within the lodge to produce what is known as a first day cover commemorating the unveiling of the new series of four different Jack-O-Lantern forever stamps in Anoka on Sept. 29<sup>th</sup>. A first day cover (FDC) is an envelope with an image on the left side (called a cachet) that relates in some way to the postage stamp that is on the envelope (cover). These are usually produced in connection with the release of a new postage stamp. They can be from the United States Postal Service (USPS) or anyone else who wants to make one up. These covers are then usually cancelled with a special cancellation from the issuing post office (in this case Anoka) that says "First Day of Issue". Other forms of commemorative cancelations may also appear on the cover. Once suitably cancelled these covers become a collectable item especially for stamp collectors. However anyone who wants to have a piece of local or lodge history can also obtain one. These first day covers are generally only produced once and are then in limited supply.

Our project to produce an Anoka Lodge FDC is now complete and is for sale in lodge as well as on the website. In lodge the price is \$5.00 with a single stamp or \$9.00 for a cover with all four different stamps on it. The website prices are \$6.00 and \$10.00 to cover the costs of shipping and handling.

I would like to thank Bro. Scott Franz and his daughter for their help in making the graphic image used to produce the cachet. I would also like to thank Bro. Thomas Senenfelder and his wife Michelle foe helping in applying the stamps to the covers and to WB Jordy Stradtman for helping with the cancellation process at the Anoka post office and to Bro. Myron Shelton for his work in putting it on our website. And of course all the Officers for their support in this effort.

I would also like to draw your attention to the image (cachet) that appears on the left side of the cover. It is what is known as a revenue stamp. These stamps were issued in the past as a sort of country wide sales tax. Two items that used to be taxed in such a way were matches and over the counter medicines. This particular stamp was issued in the mid -1880s by Wm. E. Clarke for his product known as "Hunts Remedy". For our purposes the stamp provides three different levels of meaning. First the obvious relationship to a typical Halloween scene. Second is that of a man fighting off death by the use of Hunts Remedy. The third is for those who have eves to see the many images and symbols of the MM degree to be found in the stamp. I believe the last two were intended by Wm. E. Clarke who no doubt was a brother. For more info on this stamp search "Hunts Remedy".
