


Greetings from the South

525,600 minutes. It's more than just a catchy line in a song from the Broadway Musical RENT, it really works out to the number of minutes in a year, and the year has flown by faster than you could have imagined.

Our Craft teaches us that of all the gifts we are given, time is the most precious. Sure, we learn to make a proper use of the Level, the Plum and Square, the Trowel. We learn to divest the vices in our lives by a constant application of the Trowel. But that 24 inch Gauge is one that, I know for me at least, often gets left behind - like in the writing of this article for you today.

In the EA Degree, we are taught that the 24 inch Gauge is emblematic of the hours in the day, whereby we find 8 hours for our usual avocation - our normal jobs.



I know many of us have a hard time with this one, where we spend more than eight hours at work, especially if you add in the time for the commute. I know that, at one point, I was working 10 hours at the job with a three hour round trip to and from there.

We also are supposed to find eight hours for the service to God and a worthy Brother in distress. I know that we do charity work, and, again, sometimes we find that we are doing multiple service works for those charities that we love and work with. That leaves eight hours for refreshment and sleep. If you add up the other two, however, you find that sometimes, or often, that leaves less than eight for refreshment.

My Brothers, at this time of the year, I urge you, find those eight hours as often as you can. You are no good to yourselves, your families and to the Craft if you are not at your peak. More so, you will find yourself missing the little things - the twinkle of lights, the smile in a child's eye, the beauty of the fallen snow (it can be beautiful in manageable doses, you know). I find that if I am not refreshed, my service to Deity and those in distress suffers, as does my Avocation. So take the time, take a half day off from that Avocation if you can and just relax.

In closing, may the beauty of this season touch you all in some way, and may you find that eight hours you seek.
