Greetings from the West.....

In a letter from Edmund Burke to Thomas Mercer, one of the biggest points that I often reflect upon is the statement in that letter "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing." While thinking about this quote, and

looking it up, I found a lot of references to Burke, and his philosophies. In doing that research, I found something even more powerful than the very well-known quotation.

While this alone is a fantastic reminder for all of us, the longer essay "Thoughts on the Cause of the Present Discontents" (1770), he goes on to expand this thought. "Whilst men are linked together, they easily and speedily communicate the alarm of any evil design. They are enabled to fathom it with common counsel, and to oppose it with united strength. Whereas, when they lie dispersed, without concert, order, or discipline, communication is uncertain, counsel difficult, and resistance impracticable. Where men are not acquainted with each other's principles, nor experienced in each other's talents, nor at all practiced in their mutual habitudes and dispositions by joint efforts in business; no personal confidence, no friendship, no common interest, subsisting among them; it is evidently impossible that they can act a public part with uniformity, perseverance, or efficacy."

Do you remember the bible quote from our Degrees? "Behold, how good and pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity". I have been thinking of this biblical lesson and the admonition of Burke of late. We have a constant struggle against things that WE see as "Wrong". It might be against a commonly held "wrong" such as poverty, oppression of a person or group, it may be against the injustice of poverty, disease, destruction or other common evil of the world. Sometimes it is a personal wrong or evil - maybe it is against those who eat pickles, like 14th century Gregorian chants, or the color Salmon (it is a fish, it's a dinner, not a color after all). But in any case, we must remember the fact that we are admonished that we should dwell in unity.

What happens, though, when we must stand in opposition to something that is evil in the world? In many cases it is simple, in that there is a simple definition of that evil. However, as with many things, we are often faced with a situational evil or a personal definition of what is wrong. The longer quotation above sets it out though and is a lesson that I consistently try to bring into my life. When men are not acquainted with each other's principles...it is impossible that they can act a public part with uniformity. Now that... that fits in with the concept of unity. And that is a grand ideal that I strive for daily.

As we move into the summer, we are less busy at Anoka Lodge. We are not dark, and now that we have

Air Conditioning, maybe the Lodge will stay busier over the summer, who knows? During this down time, however, I ask you to think about that unity. By understanding each other, maybe we can better come together in unity. We have heard our Past Masters give so many lessons to us. We have concepts of the fact that without Masonry, you wouldn't be in our lives. We ask our candidates to hold our honor and reputation kindly and carefully in their hands, as we pledge to do the same. It's easy to do these things when you KNOW the other man, when you understand him at a deep and personal level, and not so easy when you do not.

Spend some of that down time this summer making that connection or renewing an old one. Go out for coffee, a ball game. Come down to Lodge and eat a meal, sit together during the meeting. Catch up on each other's lives, and what's going on in them. Give them support, love and Brotherhood, and be the example of what it means to dwell in unity.


