To Our Anoka Masonic Family,

Like most of you, The Bones Brothers have been impacted by the COVID-19 virus. Many of us now work from home and all our events at the end of March and beginning of April have been cancelled. However, that doesn't mean we can't cook safely and redirect our efforts. As an organization, we have decided to assist those most in need in our Anoka Masonic Family by filling their freezers with good food. We know that we can safely adhere to the local health, CDC, and Grand Lodge guidelines fully as we make this food. To be clear, we will be making this food at home as individuals, rather than grouping together. The food will be labeled with the name of the person who made it and the date and address where it was prepared.

We will offer a variety of meat ready for freezing or reheating, to those in our Anoka Masonic Family that need it at this time, those most at risk from this virus that should not be leaving their home if at all possible. We are also offering it to those who may be financially struggling because of this pandemic and the businesses that have temporarily shut down.

We are sending this communication electronically only. If you know of someone in our Anoka Masonic Family who could use this, please submit a request on their behalf. They don't need to be members here or family, if you know they are in need, please feel free to request on their behalf.

Here's how it's going to work. Over the next two or three weeks, we're going cook meat and take it to Lodge or deliver it if requested. We don't know what will be available when we go shopping, so we're not going to be too specific about what we're offering. It will be beef, pork, and poultry, nothing too fancy. It will all be fully cooked, and vacuum sealed in one- or two-pound bags. It will be free of charge. If you want to donate, that's ok. If we end up making a profit, that money will be donated to the <u>World Health Organization COVID-19 Response Fund</u>.
