"The month of February is particularly significant to me, and I hope to all of our Brother Masons in New York and wherever located throughout the world. They are dates of great importance to all of us as family men, Masons and Americans. First there is **St. Valentine's Day**, February 14th, when we all pause to remember our ladies ... our Mothers, our wives and significant others and all of our ladies. This is another opportunity to express our thanks and appreciation for all that they do to make our lives happier and richer by their support. While we should always



remember to say "Thank You!" to our wives and Mothers whenever we can and in a meaningful way, Valentine's Day gives us a timely opportunity to include our sisters and daughters and especially the surviving spouses of our Brother Masons, in our thoughts and prayers.

February also marks the Birthday of many men who are important to us as Masons. "

This month we also remember Brother **George Washington**, whose Birthday is February 22. George Washington joined the Masonic Lodge in Fredericksburg, Virginia, at the age of twenty in 1752. During the War for Independence, General Washington attended Masonic celebrations and religious observances in New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania. He also supported Masonic lodges that formed within army regiments. At his first inauguration in 1791, President Washington took his oath of office on a Bible from St. John's Lodge in New York. During his two terms, he received Masonic delegations from several states, and participated over the cornerstone-laying ceremony for the U.S. Capitol in 1793.

In retirement, Washington became charter Master of the newly chartered Alexandria Lodge № 22, sat for a portrait in his Masonic regalia, and in death, was buried with Masonic honors. Such was Washington's character, that from almost the day he took his Masonic obligations until his death, he became the same man in private that he was in public. In Masonic terms, he remained "a just and upright Mason." Brother Washington was, in Masonic terms, a "living stone" who became the cornerstone of American civilization.

Let us remember our Ladies and Brother Washington this month as both are very important to us as masons!


