

Greetings from the Royal Arch! Shekinah #52 UD!



The Royal Arch has been called by Laurence Dermott, Grand Secretary of the Antients as the "root, heart and marrow of Masonry". Many years ago the Royal Arch was considered so essential to Freemasonry that it was included as an essential part of the Degree system. Many would argue that the Royal Arch completes the Three degrees and answers many unanswered questions left by the other three degrees. Some of the words used in its ritual are considered among the oldest known in Masonry. The exact origins of the Royal Arch are lost in history but many scholars believe it may be one of the oldest forms of Freemasonry. Some scholars

think it might have been the "original" Masters Degree and that the Third Degree we now use was a later version. Whether this is true or not I'm not sure but I do know that the Royal Arch is an important part of Masonry. Brother George Washington advanced through the Royal Arch as did other contemporaries of his time as one's journey as a Freemason was not considered complete until passing through the Royal Arch.

I would invite my Masonic brothers to continue their search for more "light" by petitioning the Royal Arch for membership, you will not regret it as this degree has some of the most life changing Masonic work you will experience. Finally as a reminder, Royal Arch will be "DARK" for June, July and August and will resume the 4th Wednesday of September at 7pm. Enjoy the summer and I'm looking forward to seeing everyone back then if not sooner. Several of the companions will be attending the York Rite Grand Session June 23-25 in Alexandria, MN.

Reading From "The Cryptic Freemason", Volume 4, Issue 9, Fall 2019:

Zerubbabel has been one of the most patronized of all historic figures, scarcely secondary to King Solomon and Hiram Abif, for the legend of the Second Temple has been one of the most widely used in Masonic degrees, forming part of the legend of the Royal arch degrees in both the York and Scottish Rites and all of the legend of the Order of the Red Cross in the York Rite and the 15th and 16th degrees of the Scottish Rite known a Knight of the East and Prince of Jerusalem, respectively, also appearing in some lessor rites. The various parts of the legend, not always told completely or in the same arrangement, the York Rite using one degree and the Scottish two, are principally as follows: The removal of the rubbish and debris of Solomon's Temple and preparation for the building of the Second Temple by the Jews who had been allowed to return from Babylon disclosed underground vaults or crypts which, when explored by various proceedings in the several degrees, yielded the secrets of Freemasonry which had been deposited by King Solomon and the two Hiram's (as more particularly detailed in the Cryptic Rite)
