From Zabud Council #10.....



Greetings Anoka Masonic Family from the Officers of Zabud Council No.10, Cryptic Masons of Minnesota.

We meet on the 4th Wednesday of the month following Shekinah Chapter No.52 U.D., at approximately 8PM.

I must say fall is my favorite time of year but perhaps you disagree. My wife would, as it reminds her that winter is on its heels, but I don't mind winter either. However, most

would agree that the colors this time of year are splendid. I have a purple leaf ash tree in my backyard that is showing off its color now. Speaking of purple, this is the color most seen at a Council of Cryptic Masons. Purple is the color of royalty and is mentioned in the Bible 48 times. The word purple is translated from the Hebrew word "argaman" meaning red-purple or purple. For the Cryptic Council we will look at this color for three reasons.

First, purple was used as one of the materials in the building of the Tabernacle. God commanded Moses to include this color in making the ten curtains. The veil that separated the Holy Place from the Most Holy Place used purple, blue, and scarlet. Purple was also used when making the garments for the High Priest.

Secondly, and what's most important to Royal and Select Master's, is the use of purple during the building of King Solomon's Temple. He especially requested a weaver skilled in making fabric in purple and other various colors.

Lastly, we who represent as Select Masters during our closing we are told that Phoenicians are involved in rebuilding the Temple. Purple dye was made by the Phoenicians and its root word, Phoenicia means "land of purple". It is said in ancient times that purple dye was more expensive than gold because this color would not easily fade in any weather, especially bright sunlight.

It's important to Cryptic Masons to remember that purple comes from a mixture of red and blue signifying the relationship between the Blue Lodge, Royal Arch and Cryptic Masonry. So, when we put on our aprons bordered with purple we should remember the importance of the color we wear.
